memory so farre fails to be my last will and
testament that is to say after my Sorrowe & Distress
that my body be decently interred and after all
my just Debts and funeral Expenses are paid I will
and bequeath unto my deare & beloued Brother George
Mordant the residue of my property whatsoever
and whatsoever for the benefit of my poor children
vizt Edward Mordant Charles Mordant John &
Mordant and George Mordant the summe of
so much of the principal as shall be found &
necessary to be appropriated towards the buriering
and bringing up my said children the Mordants
of the principal to be divided between my poor
children Edward Charles Mordant John &

nowdament and George Grindalant equally share and it
share alike as they shall afford for age of twenty one
years and in case one or more of them dies before
they attain the age of twenty one years their share
or shares to go to the survivor or survivors and
of so turbly nominate and appoint my daurcher &
beloved Brother George Grindalant to be sole Executor
of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I have

John Somm Dougall of the East India Company's
New Office London Square in the city in the
County of Middlesex subscriber made oath
that he knew and was well acquainted with Ever
Grindalant late of Putney in the County of Surrey
deceased for a great many years before and to the
time of his death and during such time had at
frequently seen him write and subscribe his name
to bills and cheques thereby becoming well acquainted
with his manner and character of handwriting and
subscription and having more carefully viewed and
inspected few paper writing wherein deceased purporting
to be the last Will and Testament of the said
deceased the same beginning thus "In the name of
God Amen & Ever Grindalant of the East India
Company London being weak in body" and ending thus
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this seventeenth day of March 1807 and then
subscribed Ever Grindalant his Deponent saith ac-
cordingly and in his conscious belief the name of
Ever Grindalant so subscribed to the said will to be
of the proper handwriting and subscription of the
said Ever Grindalant deceased - Jno. Dougall - same
day the said John Somm Dougall was duly sworn
to the truth of this affidavit before me - S. Pearson
Sur. present - & comrte - St. Job.

This will was proved at London
the eighth day of March in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eight before the
most reverend Samuel Pearce Person Doctor of Laws and
Bishop of the Right Honourable Sir William &
Wynn Bishop Doctor of Laws Master of the
Commons of the Provisory Court of Canterbury lawfully
constituted by the said George Grindalant the Doctor

said Will to whom Administration was granted of all and
singular her Goods Chattels and Credits of her said
deceased having been first sworn duly to administer

sum of three hundred and fifty pounds stock in
her house for her two sisters Grace Mason of her
parish of Brutton in the said County of Hereford -
Catherine Glendinning wife of the said William -
Glendinning and Mary Elizabeth true wife of William
true of Bow Street Lane Market in the said County
of Hereford and to make or cause to be made in
the same like proportions the said property whatsoeuer
real or personal which I may be so bounden entituled
to or possess at the time of my decease in her equal
proportions share and share alike the same to be
paid unto my said two sisters Grace Mason Catherine
Glendinning and Mary Elizabeth true wife daughters
after my decease and I appoint and constitute my
said Brother in law William Glendinning my sole
Executor to bear my last Will and Testament written
on tenor sides of paper and signed or marked by my
mark on the first and second sides and signed or
marked by my mark and sealed with my seal in
the third and last side hereof in the presence of the
three credible witnesses whose names are hereunto
subscribed as attesting the execution of the same dated
this fourteene day of February in the year of our Lord
one thousand eight hundred and eight - Thomas Mason
