I do hereby acknowledge my self to be the sole owner of all my right and title in  
and to all my right and title in and to all my lands and tenements and  
possessions whatsoever in and to all my right and title in and to all my  
lands and tenements situated lying and being in the several Towns Hamlets parishes  
Fields meadows and Territories of Beeston aforesaid and Sandy and Brookhill or any  
of them or elsewhere in the County of Bedford as were vested in the said Charles Riggs  
and James Slye and their heirs and off-sights for ever to the several purposes  
therin mentioned and particularly in trust for the sole use and benefit of my  
only daughter by my said late husband George Aldredmont now and then  
living after the decease of my said late husband George Aldredmont and  
myself and other children as I should have by my said husband or  
wheresoever I have no other child by my said late husband but my said daughter  
Mary and whereas by the said instrument it is provided that in case my said son  
daughter Mary should depart this life without issue of her body lawfully  
begetten and that I should have no other issue by my said late husband George  
Aldredmont that after the decease of my said late husband and after my con  
cease the said Charles Riggs and James Slye and the survivor of them and  
the heirs of such survivors shall convey all and singular the lands and premises  
before mentioned unto such person or persons and for such estates and Estates as  
by my last Will and Testament in writing should at any time or times be  
directed and appoint whether sole or married or establisht by two or more heidly  
successors and for want of such direction and appointment then to William Ol  
ston my nephew and son of my sister Elizabeth Olston by William Olston  
husband whereof the said Margaret Aldredmont do hereby ratify and  
confirm all and singular the lands and premises in the said written instrument  
mentioned unto my said daughter Mary and her heirs for ever also do hereby  
direct and appoint them the said Charles Riggs and James Slye and the survivor of  
them and the heirs of such survivors to convey and assign the same to my said son  
daughter Mary and her heirs for ever after my Will and Writ and further is that

my Executor and Guardian to my said daughter Mary hereafter mentioned  
 do and shall out of the Rents issues and profits of my said Lands and Tenements  
 pay out and expend yearly and every year in the Maintenance and Education  
 of my said Daughter Mary who is my only Child the sume of Threestore  
 pounds until my said Daughter Mary shall attain her age of fourteen years  
 and after her attainment of the age of fourteen years can out and expend yearly  
 and every year in the Maintenance and Education of my said Daughter Mary  
 the sume of fourstore pounds until she attain her age of One and Twenty years  
 And my will and mind is that at my said Daughter Marys attainment of her  
 said age of Twenty and One years the Tenementes of the said Lands and Tenements  
 be transferred to my said Daughter Mary and not before And my  
 Will and Mind further is that my said Daughter Marys Guardian hereafter named  
 shall and may pay out of the Rents and profits of my said Lands and Tenements  
 yearly and every year until my said Daughter Mary shall attain her said age  
 of One and Twenty years the sume of Ten pounds to such person or persons  
 as he his Executors or Administrators shall think fit for the managing and  
 receiving the Rents of the said Lands and premises and other Lands of my  
 five pounds per annum at Cire-Cabellot in the said County of Bedford settled  
 in her by her said late father But in case my said Daughter Mary my  
 shall happen to depart this life without leaving issue of her own body or in case  
 she leave issue and all such issue die under the age of One and Twenty years  
 without issue Then my Will and Mind is and I do hereby give and bequeath  
 all my said Lands and Tenements and hereditaments unto my said stepson William  
 Ollston of my said Sister Elizabeth Ollston by her late husband William  
 Ollston and to the heirs and offissors of my said stepson William Ollston for  
 ever And in case his said steply sume of Ten pounds hereby ordered to be  
 paid for the management and receiving the before mentioned Rents during my  
 said Daughters minority shall not be allowed by such person or persons as shall  
 or may be intituled to the personal Estate of my said Daughter than in such  
 case I do hereby direct and appoint the said Charles Digges and James Digges  
 and the survivor of them and the survivor of such survivor out of the first Rents  
 and profits of my said Lands and premises that shall be received after my said  
 Daughters Death to pay unto my said Daughter's Guardian herin after named  
 his Executors or Administrators the sume of Ten pounds for Every year that my  
 said Daughter shall live after my Decease and notwithstanding the age of One and Twenty  
 years and to hereby charge the said Lands and Tenements with the payment  
 Hereof before his devise to my said stepson William Ollston take effect Item I give and  
 devise unto my friend Mr George Beckman the sume of Ten pounds and to  
 Elizabeth brother my late decess'd said the sume of Ten pounds owing to my late  
 Sister Elizabeth Ollston and her present husband Mr John Ollston the sume of  
 Twenty pounds to buy them and my said stepson William mourning due to  
 my brother in law Charles Digges and his wife Twenty pounds to buy the  
 them of Mourning item all the rest and residue of my personal Estate after  
 my debts paid and funeral and legatary discharged I give unto the said Charles  
 Digges his Executors and Administrators upon his death to putt the same out at an  
 interest upon the best security that may behove and pay the same with the interest  
 and protect the self to my said Daughter Mary at her age of One and  
 Twenty years And in case the same or any part thereof shall happen to  
 be lost the same to be the loss of the said Mary unless by the willfull default  
 of the said Charles Digges or his Executors But in case my said Daughter  
 Mary shall depart this life before she attain her said age of One and Twenty  
 years then I give and devise the said lessions of my personal Estate with the

Interest and improvement thereof unto the said Charles Diggs his Executors  
and Administrators from all the best and advice of my Lands Cements and —  
Agreements whatsoever in the Kingdom of Great Britain I give to my  
said Daughter Mary and her heirs for ever and do hereby make the said  
Charles Diggs sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking  
all former Wills by me made and do declare this only to be my last Will and  
Testament and do hereby appoint the said Charles Diggs Guardian to my said  
Daughter Mary in testimony whereof I have to oath sheet of this my Will the  
whole being contained in two sheets of paper set my hand and seal this Twenty —  
third Day of February anno Domini 1720/1 Margaret Woodham signed sealed  
published and declared by the said Margaret Woodham the Testatrix as and for  
her last Will and Testament in the presence of us who in the said Testator's presence  
also subscribed names as witnesses hereunto after attesting a whole line between  
the Eighteenth and Nineteenth lines of the said sheet as witness: Lucy and William Odell

I declare before you all that I live in the parish of Stepney in the County of Middlesex  
but being it is possible to say but of sound memory and understanding doe —  
make this my last Will and Testament first I give my sonnes with the assistance  
of Margaret in the County of Kent unto my dear Wives Alroyse and his heirs —  
lawfully to be begotten for ever of whall the best residue and remainder of  
my Estate both real and personal all whatsoever and wheresoever I give devise and  
bequeath to my dear Wife Elizabeth Alroyse for and during the term of her  
natural life or ther after my dease to and amongst my Children as may seem  
most proper and convenient to be distributed by my said wife in and by her last  
Will and Testament or by any other good writing under her hand and seal  
executed in the presence of and testified by two credible witnesses I verily do —  
make my said dear Wife Elizabeth full and sole Executrix of this my last Will  
and Testament revoking all others by me made and I declare this to be my last —  
Will and Testament by any other good writing under her hand and seal this Eighteenth —  
Day of February One thousand seven hundred and Sixty one in the reign of Georgii  
Regis III. Optimo. the next of Alroyse Alroyse. I signed sealed published and declared  
by the said Alroyse Alroyse in and for his last Will and Testament in the presence  
of us who have attested the same in the Testator's presence Joseph Woodward an  
Alary Carsden Esq: 20 June 1720.
