and annulling all and every will or Wills by me heretofore made and declaring this to be my last Will and Testament Whereas on my marriage with my present wife Hannah Campbell otherwise Palmer I settled on her the sum of one hundred pounds late currency of Ireland and also one third part of whatever landed property of every kind whatsoever that I might die possessed of I do hereby by this my last Will and Testament confirm the said Settlement so made by me Whereas I hold a Bond of the Reverend John Lymbury bearing date the Thirteenth day of September one thousand eight hundred and twenty three and payable to me and my wife the said Hannah Palmer for the sum of one hundred and fifty three pounds late Irish Currency now I do give and bequeath all my right title and interest in said recited Bond and all interest due thereon and all benefit and advantage to which I may be entitled thereto to my said wife Hannah Palmer and to her executors administrators and assigns for her own sole and separate use and benefit And Whereas I hold another Bond of the said Reverend John Lymbury bearing equal date with the last recited Bond and payable to Denis Lymbury of Ballinlough as Trustee to my said wife Hannah Palmer for the sum of Four hundred and twenty pounds late currency of Ireland now I do give and bequeath all my right title and interest in said last recited Bond and all interest due thereon and all benefit and advantage deriving to me therefrom to my said wife Hannah Palmer and to her executors administrators and assigns for her own sole and separate use and benefit the said two recited Bonds being her own sole and separate property I do give and bequeath to my said wife Hannah Palmer all my right title and interest in my House at Ossur Bank the lands therunto belonging and ten houses and gardens situate on the road leading to Tramore all of which are now in my possession and are held by me by lease under the Lepre Hospital and also all my plate household furniture House linen Cattle and stock of every description and farming utensils during the term of her natural life with remainder as hereinafter set forth I give and bequeath to my said wife Hannah Palmer my Mourning Box to be her own property which consists in Interests in houses I leave and bequeath as follows I leave and bequeath to my dear daughter Fanny Sullivan the wife of Thomas Sullivan the sum of Forty pounds sterling for her own sole and separate use and benefit I do give and bequeath to my Grand daughters Frances and Mary Ann Palmer the daughters of my deceased son John Palmer the sum of fifteen pounds sterling each over and above the sums of money at present lodged in the Savings Bank of Waterford in their own names the said last mentioned sum of Forty pounds and thirty pounds to be paid out of the rents of my houses in the manor of St. Johns as the same may be paid and received I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Moran the sum of one shilling and this Grant will not be looked on in an invidious or improper light she having already got more than

than her full share and proportion of any property I may die possessed of I give and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my property in the houses in the manor after payment of the legacies hereinbefore mentioned and also of my funeral Expences and my debts (if any) to the children of my dear son William Palmer to be equally divided between them share and share alike And whereas I have given and bequeathed my houses & land which I hold under the Lepre Hospital and also all my Household furniture Plate Cattle stock and farming implements to my wife Hannah Palmer during the term of her natural life I do therefore will and bequeath that after the death of my said wife Hannah Palmer all my interest in my said Houses and land at Ossur Bank which I hold under the Lepre Hospital and also all my household furniture Plate House linen Cattle and stock of every description shall be equally divided between the children of my son John William Palmer and William Sullivan interlined the eldest son of my daughter Fanny Sullivan share and share alike And Whereas I was induced about three months ago to sign a will which at present is in the hands of my brother Henry Palmer I do hereby utterly revoke and annul the said last mentioned will and do declare it to be void and of none effect and I do hereby nominate and appoint Gregory Lymbury of Ballinlough Esquire and Thomas Barnes of the City of Waterford nailmaker to be executors of this my last Will and Testament Given under my hand and seal this 18th day of February 1837 H. Palmer (sic) signed sealed published and declared by the said William Palmer as his last Will and Testament in our presence and who in his presence and in the presence of each other have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses thereto - William Gouch - Robert Gouch - Bat.
