estate I devise as followeth Item I give and devise unto my brother John Morant
the summe of One thousand and three hundred pounds of lawfull English money
to bee paid unto him by my Executors herein after named within one year next
after the issue or expiration of this my Will and in the meantime
until the same shall be paid I devise forty pounds per annum part of
the summe or interest thereof to bee disposed of yearly at the best advantage
for the use of my said brother John Morant and to bee paid him at the
time before appointed Item I give and devise unto my brother Henry Morant
the summe of Twenty shillings and to my sister Elizabeth the like summe of Twenty
shillings Item I give and devise my severall Trunks and Boxes of Cloathes
to my said Brother John Morant her giving one moiety thereof in three
parts to bee divided to my said Brother Henry or the value thereof in money
I give and devise unto S^r John Morant of Weston in the County of Warwick
Eight and Barron the summe of One hundred pounds and unto S^r Edward
Robart of Grayes Inne in the County of Middle Lent I devise the summe of
One hundred pounds and I give unto Samuel Turner of Mandeville in the
County of Essex Ten pounds to buy him mourning Item I give
and devise unto Joseph Fletcher of Weston in the County of Middle Lent
pounds And I doe hereby nominate and ordaine the said S^r John Morant
and Edward Robart Executors of this my last Will and Testament during

Item to the same every year during my life of my Bremenford. Item

his age of fourteene and twenty years And I will that after my said sonne
Lambert shall accomplish his age of fourteene and twenty years he shall
enter the same and from thenceforth give and bequeath the said lands
and tenements in Blyford between Bulford aforesaid to my said sonne
Lambert and his heires forever the same paying out of the same to my sonne
Edward One hundred pounds at his age of one and twenty years and
to my daughter Bridget One hundred pounds at her age of one and
twenty years or day of mariage which shall first happen Item I give
to my sonne Edward the summe of fourteene hundred pounds to bee paid him
by me
